Vocabulary Activities Using Tier Two Words Tier One Words: Basic words (clock, baby, happy) - rarely require instruction in school Tier Two Words: Frequently occurring words for mature language users (coincidence, absurd, fortunate) - ***Instruction in these words can add productively to a student's language ability*** Tier Three Words: Low frequency, often content specific
